R3 Create a caterpillar in any way you want to, using any materials you have at home


Veronica followed the instructions on the video link and created a long, wiggly caterpillar by carefully folding, cutting and pasting using paper.

Room 7 learners used various materials to build arrays! A majority challenged themselves by using their knowledge of addition to understand multiplication. Ka mau te pai, Ruma






Create an ant using materials from home.


Make a puppet and use your voice




