In November last year, we received the exciting news that our school is to become "TREEmendous", thanks to Mazda NZ and Project Crimson awarding us a \$10,000 TREEmendous event to create an outdoor learning area.

Our event will be held on **Saturday 1 August**. Please save the date!



Stanhope Road School is one of four New Zealand schools selected for the 2020 TREEmendous School programme.

Alongside the community, the TREEmendous team plan to convert an unused area of the school's grounds into a learning zone to help students develop their understanding of the local environment.

Our Eco-Warriors have designed an area filled with native plants to create habitat and food for native birds, lizards, and insects, as well as a wildflower meadow for our bees, a vegetable garden and some fruit trees.

We will be joined by Mazda and Project Crimson staff, community VIPs, media and celebrities, including Ruud Kleinpaste (the Bug Man), Riley Elliot (the Shark Man), Boh Runga and Peter Wolfkamp.



It's going to be a great day for the community as well as the school. We'd love for you to join us on **Saturday 1 August** anytime from 8:30am to lend a helping hand and stay for a BBQ lunch from midday. More details to follow next term.

## STUDENT SAFETY AND PARKING WARDENS

Some drivers are using the yellow lines and our neighbor's driveways to drop off and pick up their child/ren at school.

There are also a number of parents doing U-Turns during these busy times which is highly unsafe and adds to the congestion around the school gate. We have been asking drivers not to do this as firstly it puts our students' safety at risk and secondly, it is against the law.

Those drivers that use driveways also inhibit people using the footpath, especially when they park over the footpath. We have one walking school bus route in operation with a meeting place each morning and adult supervision to see them safely to school, we encourage parents to utilise this option. We also encourage you to park 400 metres away from the school gate and walk to school.

Starting from Term 3, Parking Wardens will be visiting our school at pick up and drop off times and will issue tickets to those breaking the law. Note that there is a zero tolerance policy. If you're found committing an infringement you will receive a ticket.

Celebrate reading with the Scholastic Book Fair that will run all week in the school library. More details will follow closer to the date.




## **CHARACTER PARADE**

Slime, by David Walliams has been an exciting new novel we are reading and enjoying together.




**Room 15** students have been working on our pronunciation of Te reo by saying simple phrases and greetings.
