CHARACTER PARADE


Character Book Parade - Wednesday 12 August 9.15am

TEAM TALK - PUĀWAITANGA

Every two weeks Puāwaitanga have special 'Golden Time' on a Friday afternoon.

This is a reward for students who have been working well in class, focussing on their work and are using the school values.

They are able to choose from a variety of activities, e.g. a Kahoot quiz, knitting, board games, drumming, mindful drawing, hoop-la and other outdoor games. Here we are having fun!





To ignite this term's Inquiry, 'What is Powerful about Art?', we had a fun workshop day where we experimented with different forms of art.

Room 16. This workshop was inspired by a well known artist called Paul Kleen. He was very interested in the theory of warm and cold colours and shapes. We used Jovi's and felt tips instead of his preferred water colours.



In **Room 17**, students learned the skill of one point perspective drawing. Although this was a challenge for many students, it was wonderful to see many giving it a go! This activity showed students how to draw a 3D shape on a 2D surface (similar to the activity in Room 19). Students learnt key elements for perspective drawing such as the horizon line, vanishing point, construction and parallel lines.






In **Room 18**, we did some observational art. We sat in groups of four and used a Vivid to draw an object in front of us (e.g. a plant, a dustpan and brush...). They had 50 seconds to draw it, then they moved to another desk to see another view of the same object.

When they had drawn it from four different angles they moved to the next table for another item.

It was frenetic but fun!



TEAM TALK - PUĀWAITANGA (cont'd)

In **Room 19**, we used the power of shading to convert a 2D circle into a 3D sphere.

The video lesson we used was three minutes long, but it took us 50 minutes to get through it – lots of pauses as quality shading is not an easy business.







Room 20

In our first little taste of photography, we focused on the main elements to keep it simple. This was the 'Rule Of Thirds and Perspectives' .We also focussed on textures and light.

We were lucky it was raining in the morning so we took the opportunity to capture any reflections and droplets of rain.

Annual Fun Run




This term is the Annual Fun Run which will be held in Week 10 of Term 3 on Thursday 24 September.
